



De Bazel, our source of inspiration



The Kings Room

The Kingrooml, the largest of the rooms on the third floor, is the heart of De Bazel and a privileged place for grand, prestigious receptions, meetings, conferences, receptions and dinners. in this magnificent room with its stained glass windows, paintings and fine antique tables and chairs by Karel de Bazel, the members of the Dutch royal family were welcomed with great respect to discuss their banking affairs. Prince Hendrik and Queen Wilhelmina were welcome guests here.

Coromandel Room

The Coromandel Room was used as a meeting room for the supervisory directors of the Dutch Trading Society. The used paneling in the room is made of the Indonesian Coromandel wood.

This room is ideal for your meeting, workshops or presentation. The large sliding doors allow this hall to be an extension of the King's Hall. In this way, a conference capacity for 200 people can be realized.

Merbau Room, Seraya Room and Palissander Room

The Merbau Room, Seraya Room and Palissander Room were used as meeting rooms for the bank directors of the Dutch Trading Society. These spaces also distinguish themselves by beautiful and authentic interiors. The rooms are named after the Indonesian wood species used in the rooms.

The above rooms can be booked separately or used as break-out room(s) for larger plenary meetings in the Kings Room. All rooms are connected by sound-proof connecting doors.

When these doors are opened one large space can be created, which is very suitable for larger receptions or dinners.



Italian Room

This surprising meeting room on the second floor is ideal for round table meetings. This impressive 18th century Rococo style room with paintings of Italian landscapes is completely different from the Art Deco style in which the rest of the building is executed. The room was therefore taken 1-on-1 from a former canal house of the Dutch Trading Society.

Wagenaar room, Small boardroom and Van Eeghen room

On the second floor there are also 3 other break-out rooms with varying capacities. These spaces are designed in the well-known 1920s style.

Bode Square

When entering the second floor by elevator or stairs, you arrive at the Bode Square. This multifunctional space simultaneously exudes space and intimacy and is ideal for small presentations, receptions, lunch breaks and drinks. During conferences, this space can also be used as an extra break-out room. The impressive marble reception desk can serve as a registration point, buffet or stylish bar. Due to the light atmoshere of the Bode Square, the room can be transformed into an attractive space for receptions of all kinds in the evenings...

Central Hall

The Central Hall is located on the first floor and is ideal for large receptions, company presentations and dinners for up to 500 guests. It has a very spacious and light appearance, making it a color palette to be filled in by you. By means of mobile LED spots, this room can be transformed into an attractive space for larger groups in the evenings. Over the years, the space has also been used for fashion shows, telvision talk shows, company parties, brand kick-offs and exhibitions.

Tuschinski Theatre

Theater Tuschinski, perhaps the most famous theater in the Netherlands, was commissioned by Abraham Tuschinski and opened on October 28, 1921. The theater is built in a few different styles, including Amsterdam School, Jugendstil and Art Deco. In the period 1998-2002 a major restoration took place, first of the exterior, then of the interior. Due to its natural reception function, the location is by definition suitable and equipped for events of all kinds. With its international allure, Tuschinski knows how to inspire both domestic and foreign guests in a special way

The Canal Church

The current church building takes its name from a predecessor, the 17th-century hidden church "De Vredesduif" that once stood on Kerkstraat. The foundation stone for the current building, designed by Leiden architect Th. Molkenboer, was laid in April 1857.

The Canal Church can be reserved daily for lectures, symposia, dinners and receptions. The acoustics of the building are ideal for these kinds of events. It forms a prestigious location for business users to present their organization.

The Golden Age Church

Piling work for the Golden Age Church started in 1603, and the same year the foundation stone was laid by Johan Bicker, son of Amsterdam mayor Gerrit Bicker. The 1603 design, in Renaissance style, is by the Amsterdam city architect Hendrick de Keyser.
